

Diaconate Board Update June, 2021

We did not have a meeting in June. The next meeting is scheduled for August, 2021.

Dear Members and Friends of St. James UCC,

This letter is written to share with you, our church's new guidelines regarding church gatherings and the usage of our church premises, that will go into effect immediately.

The Board of Trustees, having reviewed the most recent state and federal guidelines regarding Covid-19, has chosen to revise certain safety policies that have been in place since the beginning of the pandemic, last year. This is done, of course, with the understanding that we will continue to watch the "numbers" and new updates from the CDC and state health officials. We appreciate your patience and prayers in dealing with such matters.

Although we may not be doing things as they may have been done in the past, let us celebrate that we are finding new ways of meeting as a church in service to the community, through Christ Jesus.

According to the most recent CDC update, "fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance." This was further reinforced by Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz who quickly followed suit, announcing a lifting of the statewide mask mandate, while retaining the CDC recommendation that only fully vaccinated people stop wearing masks. Please see the updated information with this letter regarding the new guidelines for St. James UCC.

NEW GUIDELINES AT ST JAMES U.C.C.

- Necessary precautions- Members and friends are encouraged to take all necessary steps to ensure the safety and good health of themselves, their families and all peoples at church events- including getting vaccinated.
- If you are feeling sick, or have serious health concerns, you are encouraged to refrain from coming to church at the present time. Nonetheless, as fellow members of the body of Christ, the church desires to do everything in its power, to attend to your spiritual needs- including home visitations and the serving of communion; as well as providing opportunities of watching our worship services online. Please call the Church Office to share whatever needs or concerns you might have.

The pastor and/or the diaconate when making a visit to those homebound, will wear a facemask; unless indicated to do otherwise by those visited.

- Temperature checks have been discontinued prior to the worship service on Sunday mornings by the diaconate.
- Masks and hygiene- Individuals who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks
 in any setting. Individuals who are not fully vaccinated are encouraged to continue
 wearing a facemask over the nose and mouth, and maintain physical distance. Everyone
 is encouraged to use hand sanitizer that is made available at church in order to promote
 good hygiene.
- In-person meetings- All in-person meetings at the church, for both internal and external groups may resume upon receiving scheduling clearance, via the church office
- Fellowship Hour- We have resumed our time of fellowship following worship service in the fellowship hall.

Refreshments and packaged snacks will be served to minimize the handling of food. While fellowshipping with one another, people are encouraged to maintain social distance.

- All outside entranceways- All outside entranceways leading to the sanctuary, will be opened prior to the beginning of the worship service.
- Online services- Our worship service will continue to be streamed/broadcasted via Facebook and YouTube on Sundays, and will also be made available for viewers at other times.
- In-Person worship services- Prior to worship services- bulletins, prepackaged communion elements and a offering plate (to receive your gifts) will be made available at the entranceways of the sanctuary.

You are welcome to sit wherever you like, but are still encouraged to maintain a safe distance from others. During the worship service, when engage in "passing of the peace," we encourage the practice of not shaking hands. However, smiles are not only welcomed, they are encouraged! Also, hymnals have been returned to the pews for your use. We will continue to project, on AV screens at the front of the sanctuary, all parts of the liturgy- including the words of each hymn sung. All barriers that kept individuals from sitting in certain pews have been removed. Anyone who feels a need to wear a mask for whatever reason, is encouraged to do so.

• Church Offering -Church offerings can continue to be sent via mail, online or in-person (If you are unsure as to how best to do such, please contact the church office).

- A. Church outings- Members and friends of the church are encouraged to resume all activities that might foster fellowship and community- guilds, bible studies, social events, etc. Nonetheless, excessively large groupings should be avoided.
- B. **Children** At all church gatherings and events involving children under the age of 16, the practice of maintaining good safety and health practices amongst them will be paramount.

Board of Trustees Minutes June 2021

The St. James UCC Board of Trustees met at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, June 7, 2021. Pastor Jim Wilson led the board in an opening prayer.

Call to Order: The Trustee Board meeting was called to order by Moderator, Kristal Rick, at 7:01 p.m. Chuck volunteered to lead the meeting, so Kristal could fill in as Secretary and take notes.

Members present: Chuck Anderson, Robert Hovland, Jim Martodam, Ione Hammer, Wanda Odness, Bob Holland, Ryan Erdmann, Kristal Rick, Greg Odness and Dean Ernst.

Members Absent: None

Adoption of Agenda: Motion by Dean to approve the agenda, second by Robert. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Motion by Dean to accept the Secretary's report and second by Wanda. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Tammy was present to go over her reports with the board. We are tracking on budget to-date with expenses at 41%. Inflows for the month of May were at \$9823 and Expenses were at \$8383. The money for the pew fund had been replenished from the general fund as agreed last month. Motion to approve the financial report was made by Kristal, seconded by Bob. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported on several items. He reminded the board as well as members to participate in the MN Conference Assembly, being held via Zoom this year. He suggested getting aprons for those working the church booth at the fair and Potato Days and selling t-shirts, so everyone matches and is supporting St. James. Motion by Jim, seconded by Robert for Pastor to go ahead with this project. Motion carried. He will ask some of the church groups, for help with the original funding, but sales of the t-shirts will replenish most of the funds. He is beginning the process of looking at job descriptions and will review the last updated copies with the Staff-Parish. Motion by Robert to approve the Pastor's report, seconded by Kristal. Motion carried.

Board of Trustee Minutes Continued....

OLD BUSINESS:

- **A.** Committee Reports
 - a. **Staff Parish** No report.
 - b. **Diaconate** No report.
 - c. **RE Board** Report provided and is included in the newsletter.
 - d. Buildings & Grounds
 - i. Camera & Code entry Greg & Wanda have tested one and have the approval to purchase when ready to install. It will help the office have visibility of those entering the church and will allow for easy entry via code or remotely if members need to enter the church when it is locked.
 - **ii. Handicap Pew Project** The board agreed that if handicap seating is needed, they will make reasonable accommodations in the back section of the church and the front pew are always open as well, rather than cutting some exiting pews near the front. And can revisit the topic as needed.
 - iii. Circuit breaker in kitchen The electrician called has been too busy so Greg will try to contact another. And will have him convert the old 220 behind the Bunn coffeemaker and refrigerator in the kitchen to a 110 and add the additional outlet needed for AV upstairs while he is here doing work.
 - **e.** Finance Committee No report.
 - **f. Search Committee** Our conference contact is busy with the UCC annual meeting in the coming weeks but will be present via Zoom for a meeting in July. In the meantime, Jim is planning a meeting with the committee to update them and explain the process and share info he has received so far.
- **B. COVID Follow-up** Pastor Jim had drafted new guidelines for St. James in dealing with change now with COVID as members have gotten vaccinated and things are opening up and getting back to a new normal. The board liked and approved the very comprehensive draft and agreed it should be sent out to the congregation.
- C. Elevator Contract/Update Ryan and Tammy informed the board by sharing an email communication from the head office of ThyssenKrupp in Texas that St James will be receiving one free year of Elevator Service, as we had a case because they had not held up their end of the contract.
- **D. Operating Loan Renewal** The bank had updated the revolving operating loan paperwork to reflect the changes in the maturity of the CD used as collateral. Tammy and

- **E.** Kristal will sign it at the bank to update it in case of need, but at this time St James will not be using it.
- **F. July Meeting plans** The board will meet Wednesday, July 7 with the focus to be the Search Committee with our UCC contact and focus on the next steps. The meeting will cover monthly business only as needed, as they do not typically meet in July.

NEW BUSINESS:

- **A.** Fair Booth Pizza Stand The committee is asking all members to sign up to work a shift, not just kids or families with kids. They are asking for donations of drinks and other items as well as money to cover the costs of pizza, etc. they will begin making ice for the coolers.
- **B.** Potato Days Cathy Olson provided a letter to the board saying she was stepping down as chair of the committee due to increase demands from her job, but that she will still help order the food and help in other ways. She provided a detailed list of what she has done for the event but is asking the board to find a new chairperson. The Board discussed not doing the event but also that it provides presence in the community and outreach and is also a good fund raiser. Motion was made by Ione, seconded by Robert to continue with the booth. But it will take help from member and finding a new chairperson. If anyone is interested, please contact a board member or the church office.
- C. Heidi Ackerson Benefit The event will be at the Pitchfork on Saturday, June 19 beginning at 3 pm. Tammy had emailed out a list of volunteers from St. James who will be serving the meal at the event. She asked for a few more volunteers possibly for the later shift. There will be a bake sale and silent auction as well, so if members are willing to provide a basket of items for the auction, please do so by June 17, and try to donate baked good items for that Saturday.
- **D.** Other Bob made the motion and agreed to purchase a Ring Doorbell for the Church main entry, seconded by Robert. Motion carried. There also needs to be a list of contact names and numbers listed near the door to allow members access.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Jim led the board in a closing Prayer.
